From 5-8pm participating businesses and restaurants welcome everyone in for great art, great food and wonderful friendship. No admission or tickets are necessary, simply enjoy our hospitality! Look for the Art Walk signs along the sidewalk to indicate participating locations.

- July 21 **Dog Day at the Farmers Market** - dog friendly activities throughout the Market.
- August 11 **Pocaroo** - hosted by Pocatello Magazine and The TBA at the Pavilion beginning at 4pm. Live bands, food, vendors, cold beverages and more.
- August 25 **Old Town Block Party** - on the 100 block of South Main Street hosted by Flipside Lounge, featuring live music, vendors, art, beer garden, food, crafts and more!
- August 27 **Welcome Back Orange & Black** - the business community comes together to welcome back our Idaho State University students, staff and faculty at the Old Town Pavilion from 4-7pm.
- October 12-13 & October 19-20 **Haunted History Walking Tours** - We are famous for our tours! This year visit four haunted locations in the historic warehouse district. Tickets go on sale on August 1 at the Old Town office, 420 N. Main St.
- October 31 **Trick-or-Treat the Old Town Streets** - from 3 to 5:30pm merchants have candy and treats for all the kids.
- November 9 & 10 **Old Town Merchants Holiday Open Houses** - the holiday season begins in style as our merchants open their doors and showcase the best decorating and gift ideas.

## *While you are here be sure to stop and see:*

- All of our historic buildings! Historic Walking Tour Brochures are available at the Old Town Office at 420 N. Main Street, at the Chamber of Commerce Office at 324 S. Main Street, or on our website at [www.oldtownpocatello.com](http://www.oldtownpocatello.com). Dates, names and building features throughout the area are identified along with an area map.
- “Passages of Time” a working sun dial that’s also a beautiful piece of art located at Dudunake Park, on the 300 block of South Main Street.
- One of only two Greyhound Bus Station signs still “running.” See it on the 200 block of West Bonneville and don’t forget to take a look at the Union Pacific Depot. Pocatello was originally a railroad town and the railroad continues to operate out of the Depot today.
- The Princess Theater was open at 120 South Main Street inside the historic Nicolette Hotel and was featured in the classic musical “A Star Is Born.” Judy Garland sang about “being born in a trunk, in the Princess Theater, in Pocatello Idaho.” The building is now called the Whitman but the area where the theater stood is still welcoming guests during private parties and special events.
- The oldest wood building in the city is located at 326 W. Center Street. The original Wade’s Bakery Building is now home to Decadence Board Shoppe, a wonderful marriage of the past and present.
- The Marshall Public Library, on the 100 block of South Garfield, is home to two public art pieces outside and a small art gallery inside. The historic Carnegie Library was built in 1907 and still stands as part of our modern day library.
- Speaking of public art, don’t miss the Literary Pavers throughout the area. These pieces installed in our sidewalks display selected work by local writers and poets.
- Pocatello High School, located on the 300 block of North Arthur Avenue, was originally constructed in 1892. Students still attend the school and photos of almost every graduating class are hung in the hallways. We should mention the building was also voted as the “most haunted building” in our city.
